2020 was a busy year in spite of the pandemic. We had 5th and 6th Streets paved. We also received a grant to provide partial funding for additional streets in 2021. We are in the process of determining what we can do with the funds we have available.

Every year the Village is required to complete a compliance report for their street funding. This report includes various statistics about the Village. You can read it on our website or call us for a copy.

The Village of Morley Council held a public hearing on December 14 to discuss vacating Thompson Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets. No objections were made before or at the meeting and the Council passed a resolution to vacate that section of Thompson Street. The resolution will be recorded at the Mecosta County Register of Deeds and the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services.
